Kertzer's book is based on seven years of research in the Vatican and Fascist archives, including reports from Mussolini's spies inside the highest levels of the Church."Two leaders came to power in 1922 in Rome, Achille Ratti was elevated to the papacy as Pius XI, and Benito Mussolini was appointed Italian prime minister. How relations between them developed until the pope's 1939 demise occupies this original history, which rests on Kertzer's thorough research of available Vatican archives and other sources.
